Drugs, Alcohol and Tobacco Education (DAAT)

PSHE education is a school subject through which pupils develop the knowledge, skills and attributes they need to keep themselves healthy and safe, and prepared for life and work. Well-delivered PSHE programmes have an impact on both academic and non-academic outcomes for pupils. Our PSHE Curriculum aims to develop skills and attributes such as resilience, self-esteem, risk-management, teamworking and critical thinking.

DAAT is an important element of the PSHE curriculum. The table below shows the elements that are covered in each class, on an annual basis.
