The plan has been school specific and dependent on a range of factors including: staff availability, available classrooms / learning spaces, numbers expected for each group and safety measures being in place and approved by the LA.

Prior to returning, each year group will receive specific information from their teacher to help support the transition back into school. School doesn't look like it usually would but we are working hard to ensure the children feel safe, secure and happy on their return. Their wellbeing is our main focus- everyone's lock down experience has been different. For those children remaining at home, we will continue to interact via Google Classroom. ## Google Classroom

We have now been using Google Classroom for several weeks and it seems, in the main, to be running smoothly. Thank you for all your questions and feedback; it has been a learning curve for everyone. One of positives of Google Classroom is that it organises all the work in one place and the pupils can clearly see the activities and when they were set. A negative of the system for Friezland, is the terminology Google uses. The terms "missing" and "turned in late" are not appropriate during these challenging times and should, for now, be ignored. We could turn off these notifications but then we would lose the way the learning is organised each day. Please don't worry or be concerned- just do what you can, when you can with your child.

## Returning to School: essential items

When your child returns to school, we are asking that only essential items are brought into school as we need to limit cross-contamination wherever possible. A healthy snack, water bottle, inhaler, sunhat and sun cream are essential, as is a waterproof coat on a cold/wet day because we will be learning outside whenever possible.

Those children requesting a school dinner will initially be given a packed lunch (sandwiches, wraps, sausages rolls, pizza etc.) until the LA catering team can resume the hot meal service. If you are bringing a packed lunch from home, please choose items sensibly and use a small ice-pack to keep items cool until lunch as they will be stored in the group's learning area.
