



## Music Knowledge Mat: *Hands, Feet, Heart*

Vocabulary		Know How	Know That
pulse	The heartbeat or steady beat of a song/piece of music.	To find the pulse of a song.	Traditional South African Music only uses voices and drums.
rhythm	A combination of long and short sounds that make a pattern.	To copy and clap back rhythms.	South African Music has a strong dance beat.
pitch	A word that describes high and low sounds.	To clap the rhythm of your name.	South African Music is full of energy.
tempo	An Italian word used to describe how fast/slow the music goes	To make up your own rhythm.	Electric guitars, bass, keyboards, saxophones, and trumpets are often used.
improvise	To make up a tune and play it on the spot.	To improvise using the notes C and D.	Singing often consists of call and response, call by one singer and response by lots.
compose	To put musical ideas together to create a piece of music.	To compose a simple melody & rhythm using the notes C, D, E.	
melody	Another name for a tune.	To sing Hands, Feet, Heart in groups.	
audience	A group of people that come to listen and watch a performance.		
texture	Layers of sound in music – are there lots of instruments playing/people singing (thick) or not very many (thin)?	<b>Composers and their Music</b>	
dynamics	How loud or quiet the music is.	<b>Hands, Feet, Heart</b> by Joanna Mangona	
perform	To sing or play a musical instrument for others to hear.	<b>The Click Song</b> by Miriam Makeba
