Our DLP activities started off with a planning day at Uppermill Civic Hall in September. It felt a good time to review our vision and values and ways of working given the changes since the DLP was originally set up. It was pleasing to see that not a lot of amendment was required and those original common goals still held true. We updated our 5 year plan and how this then translated in our aims for the year ahead..

Heads worked together to develop our working party plans and everything from networks to peer review was discussed. We finished the day with our plans for the year complete and a clear, agreed focus. We have decided to pull together our Transition and Curriculum Continuity and School Improvement Working Parties as a number of priorities were common to both. Financial Efficiencies and Well-being remain the same.

These plans were then fed back to, and agreed with, the Trustees at the Board meeting in October.

So this term new networks have been established (Design & Technology and SEND), a calendar of events produced, work underway on the website, a staff training event organised (see below) and data analysed resulting in a focus on primary literacy. Our ever-popular sports programmes began again.

The last Friday of the Autumn half term has become our annual staff CPD event. This year's focus was SEND which is priority for the DLP. We all met at Saddleworth School and the morning was given over to two speakers:

Colin Foley – Training Director, ADHD Foundation who role is to support teaching professionals to develop their awareness of Neurodiversity and explore ways in which organisations can adapt their practices to support inclusion. He particularly supports developments in ADHD, mental health and education.

Meet the DLPers!

As part of our regular feature of introducing you to people in the DLP today is the turn of Sarah Newton, Headteacher, Diggle Primary School



My name is Sarah Newton and I have the very great privilege of being the head teacher of Diggle School. This is a role that I have now done for the last eight years.

The team at Diggle School is absolutely amazing and I am proud of the way every single member of staff no matter what their role has the children's well-being and best interests at the heart of all we do. I couldn't ask for a more dedicated team to lead.

Our school's foundations are built on our 6 R's. We aim to develop well rounded children who do not just achieve and flourish academically but also find and develop their talents in other areas of the curriculum such as sports or the creative arts.

It is very important to me that the children that leave our school take with them **Resilience** with both emotions and work; a sense of personal **Responsibility** for their behaviour and learning and **Respect** for themselves, their peers and the adults they interact with both in and out of school.

We also teach them to be **Reflective**, **Resourceful** and help them to use their **Reasoning** skills to overcome obstacles and difficulties.

I am currently in my 31st year of my teaching career, yes I am that old! The first 14 years were spent as a classroom teacher where I taught children from Nursery to Year 6 and gained an in depth understanding of primary education across the board. I then went on to spend 5 years as a Deputy and then 3 years as the head of a small school over the hill, before finally landing in Diggle.

Being a member of the DLP has been one of the highlights of my career. Working with so many talented and knowledgeable headteachers over the last 5 years has been a joy and I have learned so much.

Apart from Diggle School my other passions are my family, my allotment and playing the clarinet and tenor saxophone. I can be found unwinding after a long day either at one of my band rehearsals or up to my elbows in soil.

Winter Writing and Art Competition
