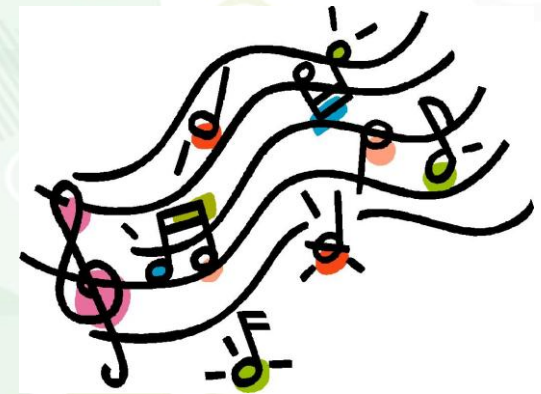
- Children MUST wear school PE kit and PE trainers/pumps.

A typical day in Class 3:

Home learning:

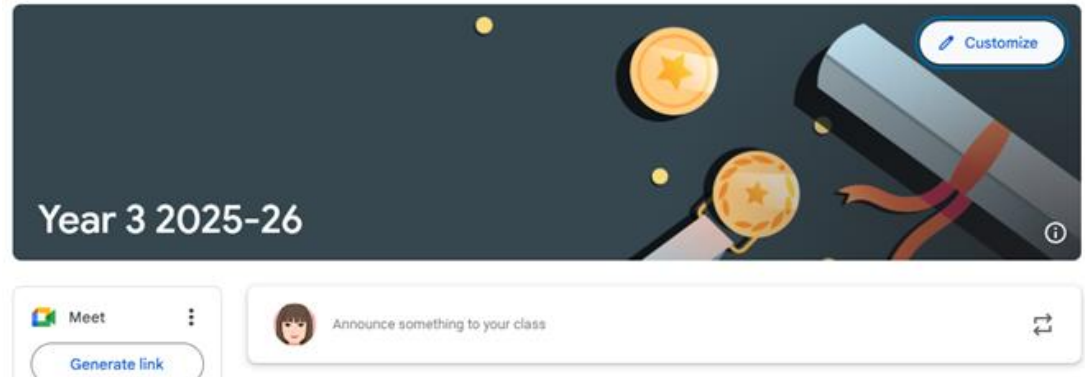
Homework will be set on Friday and is due by the following Friday.

- *Maths – online using Mathletics (1-2 challenges set per week which link to prior learning)*
- *Spelling – Online ELS spelling game set weekly and an ELS morpheme grid sent home weekly to create word sums. Every Friday there will be a spelling test focused on the root morpheme but a specific set of words will not be sent home.*
- *Reading 15 – 20 minutes x 4 times a week as a minimum. They can borrow books from school, visit their local library or read from books at home.*
- *Home learning challenges will not be sent home this term but options for children to further their learning will be posted onto google classroom throughout the term.*

Badges... All Friezland pupils are members of one of our 4 Teams and earn team points by demonstrating our Friezland Expectations. They also work hard to earn stickers towards **award badges** (bronze, silver, gold etc). Please ensure children are wearing their **team coloured badge** and their most recent **award badge** on their uniform every day. School Councillors should also be wearing their **Councillor** badge.

The Little Details:

Birthday Book Scheme... As a school with the 'Platinum Healthy School' Award and being mindful of food allergies, we do not celebrate children's birthdays with sweets or lollipops. Instead, children can bring in small items of stationery, stickers or donate a book to their class or school library. It could be a favourite fiction or an exciting non-fiction book. If you can't decide on a book, an Amazon voucher could be gifted and the class can then decide on a book together. The book is presented in assembly and then shared in the classroom.

Information for Parents and Carers

Class 3: Year B, Autumn 1, 2025

Theme: What Makes the Earth Angry?

Children will describe and understand key aspects of physical geography including volcanoes and earthquakes. They will know what causes an earthquake, be able to label the different parts of a volcano and know what a tsunami is. Finally, they will be able to identify the position of latitude and longitude, equator, northern and southern hemisphere and the Tropics.

Books

Picture:
This half term our writing will be inspired by the book 'Iron Man' by Ted Hughes. Our higher-level interpretation skills will be developed using Literacy Shed Videos resources. The children will also be exploring the characters and developing their narrative skills.

Comprehension

Discrete comprehension sessions will take place throughout the week as well as during English lessons when reading our focus text.

Poetry

We will be reading, interpreting and adapting poetry with narrative, repetition and onomatopoeia. We will write and perform our own poetry. We will be developing our understanding of language and how it can be used to create images and for other poetic and literary effects too.



Mathematics

This half term the topics being covered in **Maths** are: Place Value and Addition and Subtraction.

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Science

We will be learning about **Rocks!**

We will be doing lots of cross-curricular learning with this topic, as it links nicely with our Geography topic. The children will discover the different types of rocks and how they are formed. They will conduct an investigation to test the permeability, density and durability of given rocks, then compare and group rocks based on their appearance and simple properties.
